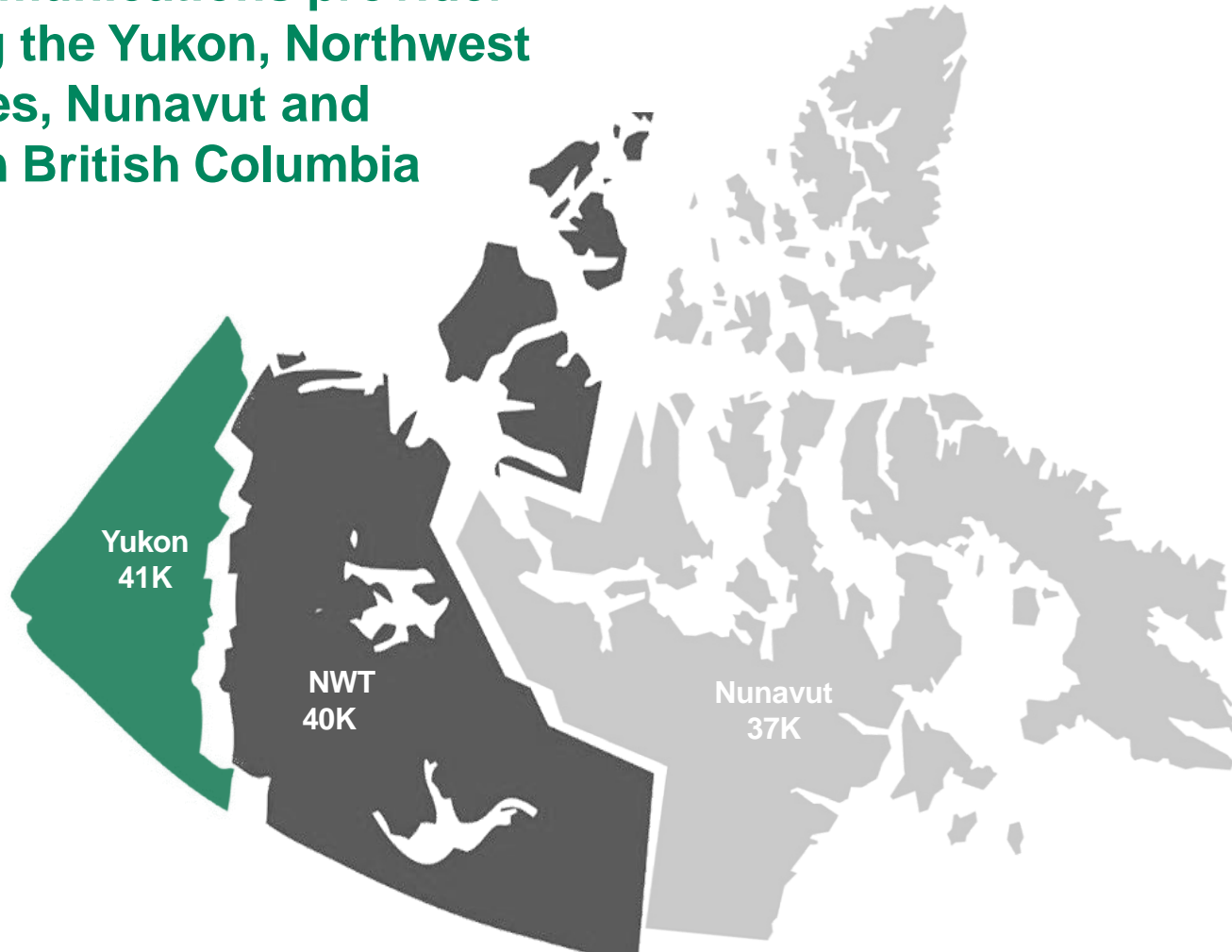

500+ northern employees

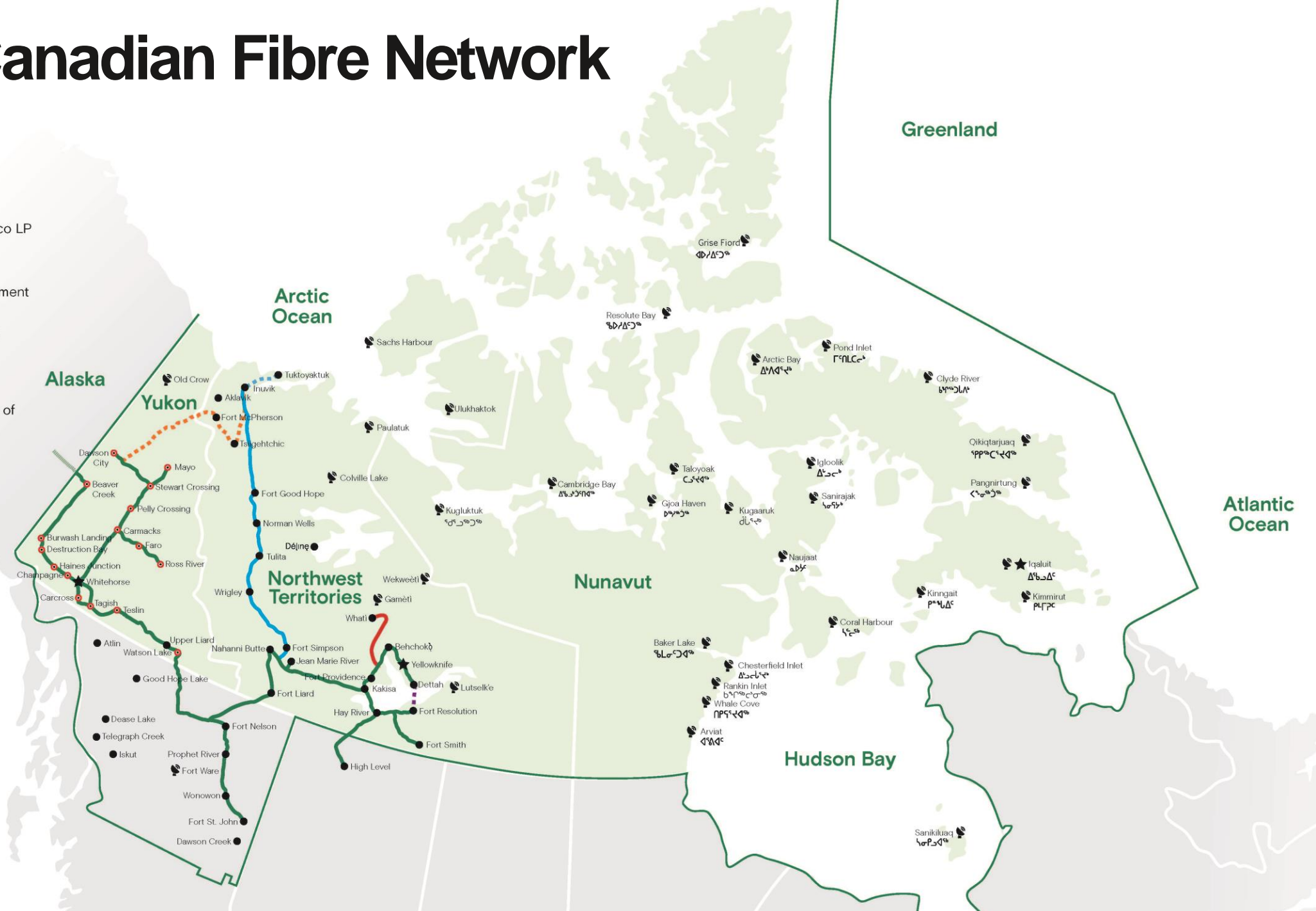

In 2019, no homes in NWT met the CRTC's broadband standard of 50/10 Mbps. By the end of this year, we expect **over 95% of the NWT will have access to fast, unlimited Internet.**



33x faster speeds in 15 communities



8 communities upgraded to low Earth orbit technology, paving the way for **50/10 + Unlimited**
